I hope this finds you well. The last 2 months have been a bit crazy with the closing of the bookstore. Schedules have been wonky to say the least. However, Historian work was still able to be done in the midnight hours from home thankfully. Due to the Bookstore closing, many folks came to the bookstore specifically to find out "Where is the Historian going now?" It has been again shown that a great many people do not know that the Historian is a separate entity from the Historical Society, and those that do know that difference, do not know that there is an office for the Historian. Historian Hours

Since my last report, I have spent 4 hours in the office. There have been an additional 17 hours of Historian duties completed outside of the Historian Office for a total of 21 hours.

Afton Historical Society

October also brought the finalization of the exterior construction needs for the Afton Historical Society Roof to ensure that the leaks were repaired and sealed up. - 6. Bolster's Barn Dance research has begun.
- 7. Street name changes database has been created.
- 8. Other past research items continue as information can be obtained.
- 9. There is a current glitch with the Facebook page as it will only allow me to post with the "Only Me." Privacy setting with no option to change the privacy setting back to public. This has been investigated and all settings are as they should be for the Facebook page to post publicly. This requires deeper nerding and will be posting again 'publicly' as soon as the issue can be found and fixed.
- 10. I have also began to delve into the geological history of Afton. This proved to be a very deep (pun intended) research project. The finding of a shell fossil from when our location was under water began the desire to look at more than just 'people and places'. History of our area began long before the name "Afton" was chosen.
