- 7. Collaborations with Glenn Windsor to preserve historical aspects of Bettsburg, including, but not limited to: rebuilding the last remaining out house in Afton, with period exact lumber from Bettsburg buildings, which is time period ways of repurposing lumber that can be utilized, as at the time, everything was hand hewn and "waste not, want not" was the goal.
